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Proposal: Fifty Percent (50%) ROTC Enrollment for NSTP Students

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Subject: Revised NSTP Enrollment Distribution (50% ROTC / 50% CWTS/LTS)

I. Introduction

This proposal advocates for a revised enrollment distribution wherein 50% of NSTP students register for the Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) and 50% for Civic Welfare Training Service (CWTS) or Literacy Training Service (LTS). This measure addresses urgent national security needs, institutional capacity constraints, and student safety concerns.

II. Rationale

A. National Security Imperative

1. Defense Preparedness Requirement:

- The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) relies on a 70% reserve force, per 804th Community Defense Center, 8RCDG
- Only ROTC graduates qualify for this reserve, per RA 9163 otherwise known as the NSTP Act of 2001. Current enrollment trends risk understaffing national defense reserves.
- Impact: Redirecting 50% of NSTP students to ROTC ensures a sustainable pipeline for AFP reserves.

B. Institutional Capacity Limitations

2. Resource Optimization:

- CWTS/LTS components will soon integrate into college curricula, competing with academic courses for schedules, faculty, and facilities.
- Impact: A 50% enrollment cap prevents overextension of limited university resources.

C. Student Safety Enhancement

3. Risk Mitigation in Community Immersion:

- Large CWTS/LTS groups conducting off-campus activities face elevated safety risks (travel, fieldwork).
- Smaller groups improve supervisor-to-student ratios, reducing hazards.
- Impact: The 50% cap enables safer, more manageable community engagements.



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
