Proposal to Participate in the Standard First-aid and Basic Life Support and Mass Casualty Incidents Management Skills

Rationale

The Philippine Development Plan 2016-2022 recognizes the need to "enhance the capability of the security sector for humanitarian assistance and disaster response" as a way to ensure public safety. While the Office of the Director of NSTP is not a security sector, it is task to capacitate the trainees on the four priority areas of DRRM. With licensed first-aiders in the training staff, we can regularly conduct drills within our rank and among our trainees. In effect, it will surely contribute to the University's effort on humanitarian assistance and disaster response.

The damages of Tropical Storm *Megi or Agaton* in our locality are proof to strengthen our approaches for a more resilient community. There is a need to increase the responders in our community. To achieve this, the Office of the Director of NSTP looks forward to strengthening the delivery of DRRM in NSTP to capacitate the trainees. In practice, we invite speakers from our partner agencies. I strongly believe it is time to chart towards sustainable student-led workshops and simulations.

Timely, the City Government of Ormoc, through the City Youth Development Office and UNIFY, Inc., in close partnership with the Philippine Red Cross and Sangguniang Kabataan will host the Provincial SFTY+ (Standard First-Aid Training for Youth) on May 11-15, 2022. The 5-day training aims to equip with the Standard First-aid and Basic Life Support and Mass Casualty Incidents Management Skills. As reflected in the invitation, upon successful completion of the training, they will become Certified First-aiders and Community Disaster and Emergency Volunteers (ACDEV) as mandated by the NDRRMC Memorandum No. 64, s.2021. We grab the opportunity to send these students (listed below) who volunteered actively in the typhoon Agaton relief operations. As reservists, they are aware and have demonstrated community service. I strongly believe that with enhanced skill-set, we can contribute to strengthen student volunteerism in the University.
