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AGRO 200B: ON-THE -JOB TRAINING (OJT) PLAN

Rationale

On-the-job training (OJT) is a practical approach in acquiring new competencies and skills needed for a job in a real, or close to real, working environment. It is often used as a channel to learn how to use particular tools or equipment in a live-work practice, simulated, or training environment. Rather than showing employees presentations or giving them worksheets, they learn about the job by doing it. This training happens at the workplace, with guidance from a supervisor, manager, or another knowledgeable employee.

The revised curriculum of the Bachelor of Science in Agriculture major in Agronomy of the College of Agriculture and Food Science (CMO No. 104 S. of 2017), VSU provides better opportunities for the students to experience the OJT to different Agricultural Enterprises or Industries that offers relevant work-related training experiences. However, due to COVID19 pandemic, the students enrolling Agro 200B or OJT for the graduating students for this 2nd semester, school year 2021 - 2022 shall be deployed for the meantime in the VSU campus in time of the implementation of the limited face to face classes.

Objectives

After the OJT the BSA major in Agronomy graduating students will be able to:

- experience the on-the-job training on work related Agronomic crops production and management for 240 hours;
- acquire skills on the different Agronomic crops production and management practices;
- relate the importance of the on-the-job training in Agronomic crops production and management to the real working condition.
