Examples:

- On May 30, 2019, a businessman loan P45,000.00 in the bank to expand his restaurant. The businessman agreed to pay the amount at a 6% rate on August 10, 2019. How much is the ordinary simple interest to be paid?
- James borrowed P13,500.00 from his aunt last December 25, 2020. He promised that he would pay at 6% interest on March 14, 2021. Determine the exact simple interest to be paid by James.

Dec. 25, 2020 ~ March 14, 2021

Dec. 25 - 31	- 6	P = P13,500
Jan. - 31	- 31	r = 0.06

Math 11n L4.2 Part 2

COMPOUND INTEREST

- is computed on a principal that changes at stated intervals when interest is added to it. This interval may be any time period during the year: annual, semiannual, quarter, month, or day.
- When simple interest is added to the principal, it is said to be converted - it becomes part of the principal.

Examples: 2 Part 2

- An amount of P 20 000.00 is invested at a rate of 2% compounded yearly. After two years, how much will the amount be?
- Ms. Lea loaned P 50 000.00 from a bank and agreed to pay the amount at 6% compounded quarterly for three years. How much will she pay after three years?

$P = 20,000$

$r = 0.02 = i$

$t = 2 = n$

$F = ?$

$$F = P(1+i)^n$$

$$= 20,000(1+0.02)^2$$

$$= P 20,808.00$$
