The University of Saskatchewan is a degree-granting institution under the authority of the Province of Saskatchewan, and a member of Universities Canada.

General Information

This transcript is a record of academic work undertaken at the University of Saskatchewan only. Students are responsible for supplying official transcripts for work completed at other institutions. The recipient is asked not to release this transcript, or copies of it, to the student whose record it contains or to any other agency.

A student is in good standing unless otherwise noted. Notations such as "Required to Discontinue" are for academic reasons and are for a period of one year unless otherwise noted.

Academic Year

The Academic Catalogue Year starts on May 1st.

The University of Saskatchewan offers classes during four academic terms. The Spring and Summer Terms consist of two seven-week terms: Spring (May to June) and Summer (July to August). The Regular Terms consist of two 13 week terms: Fall (September to December) and Winter (January to April).

A typical full undergraduate course load during the Fall and Winter terms is a combined 30 credit units.

Units of Instruction

Courses are assigned credit units.

Since 1982, a credit unit is the basic unit of instruction. A typical two-term course which meets for approximately 3 hours per week is 6 credit units, and a single-term course is 3 credit units, although courses of other weights exist.

Non-University Level

001-089 Courses intended primarily for non-degree credit programs (e.g., Business Administration Certificate and Diploma in Agriculture courses).

Undergraduate Degree

Junior level

090-099 Courses which do not require Grade 12 level preparation as a prerequisite. These numbers are used when a department also offers a junior level course in a subject for students with Grade 12 preparation.

100-109 General introductory courses not usually intended as preparation for more advanced study in the subject but designed to acquaint students with a field of knowledge in which they do not propose to specialize.

110-199 All other courses offered for junior undergraduate level credit.

Senior level

200-699 Courses intended for the upper years of direct entry degree programs or for all years of non-direct entry programs. In direct entry programs the first digit will usually indicate the year of the program for which the course has been designed.

For non-direct entry programs, first year courses are numbered 200-299, second year courses 300-399, etc.

Graduate Degree

Junior level

700-799 Introductory courses, usually intended for graduate students who have not had the generally expected undergraduate preparation in the subject.

Senior level

800-899 Courses which may be taken only by students who have completed the undergraduate level preparation generally expected for graduate level courses in the subject.

990 Graduate seminars.

992 Non-thesis graduate projects.

994 Master's program thesis.

996 Doctoral program thesis.
