The faculty has successfully implemented the OBEdized BSCE, meeting the minimum requirements of CMO 92, s. 2017 and the university. Additionally, the faculty has already secured approval for an extension project.

Outcome:

The successful implementation of the BSCE curriculum has resulted in the approval of one extension project.

Engr. Cortes has been advised to carry out research and extension projects and to implement ongoing quality improvement measures for the BSCE Curriculum.
