

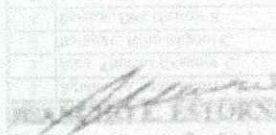

CT SCAN REPORT

IGOT FIRSO ENDRINA

THE STOMACH, DUODENUM, JEJUNUM, ILEUM, COLON AND RECTUM ARE NORMAL. THE
 ENTIRE LENGTH OF THE VISUALIZED INTESTINAL TRACT APPEARS UNREMARKABLE. THE
 APPENDIX IS NORMAL IN SIZE AND CONFIGURATION, NOT DISTENDED OR CALCIFIED. THERE IS
 NO DEMONSTRABLE COLONIC OR RECTAL MASS. THE PERITONEUM IS NORMAL IN THICKNESS.
 THERE ARE NO PERITONEAL NODULES. THERE IS NO ABDOMINAL FLUID COLLECTION.
 THE VISUALIZED RIGHT AND LEFT LOWER LUNGS ARE NORMAL. THERE IS EARLY
 OSTEOARTHRITIS OF THE THORACIC AND LUMBAR SPINE.

REMARKS: LIVER PARENCHYMAL DISEASE
 LOBULATED HETEROGENEOUSLY ENHANCING TUMORAL MASS, SEGMENT 6 OF
 THE RIGHT LIVER LOBE, CONSIDER PRIMARY HEPATOCELLULAR NEPLASIA
 BIOPSY IS RECOMMENDED
 POORLY DEFINED, SIMILAR SATELLITE LESIONS, SEGMENT 4, 5 AND 8, CONSIDER
 METASTATIC FOCI VS PARENCHYMAL SPREAD
 INADEQUATELY DISTENDED GALLBLADDER WITH CALCULOUS CHOLECYSTITIS
 (MICROCHOLELITHIASIS)
 INTRAHEPATIC BILE DUCT OBSTRUCTION LIKELY FROM PARTIAL INVOLVEMENT
 OF THE BILIARY HILUM BY THE SEGMENT 5 LESION
 BILATERAL RENAL CORTICAL CYSTS
 BORDERLINE NORMAL SIZE PROSTATE GLAND WITH CALCIFICATIONS
 PARA-AORTIC, PARACAVAL AND AORTOCAVAL LYMPHADENOPATHY, SUSPICIOUS
 FOR METASTATIC FOCI
 EARLY OSTEOARTHRITIS OF THE THORACIC AND LUMBAR SPINE
 NORMAL SPLEEN, PANCREAS, ADRENAL GLANDS, BOTH URETER AND URINARY
 BLADDER
 THE INTESTINAL TRACT APPEARS UNREMARKABLE
 NO DEMONSTRABLE COLONIC OR RECTAL MASS
 NO ABDOMINAL FLUID COLLECTION
