RE: Decision of Civil Service Commission on Ms. Delia L. Silao  
and Board Resolution No. 25

For whatever it is worth, quoted below are excerpts from a  
letter of the Civil Service Commission dated October 21, 1987 and  
Board Resolution No. 25, s. 1987:

Letter of Civil Service Commission dated October 21, 1987  
Addressed to Mrs. Delia Silao regarding her petition

..... "Sec. 5. A reassignment is the movement of an  
employee from one organizational unit to another in  
the same Department or agency which does not involve  
a reduction in rank, status or salary and does not  
require the issuance of an appointment."

From the foregoing premises, it appears that your  
questioned order dated April 30, 1987 constitutes a  
reassignment.

In the absence of any showing of abuse on the part of  
the appointing authority in the exercise of his discretion,  
we find no cogent reason to disturb the action of the  
appointing official.

WHEREFORE, for lack of merit, your instant petition  
is hereby dismissed.
