TO: SG ANTONIO BARTOLINI

RE: SUSPENSION FROM THE SERVICE

In accordance to Memorandum No. 84, s. 1990, the Investigation Committee headed by Dr. Manuel K. Palomar, conducted an investigation regarding the "break-in" incident that occurred in the Cashier's Office sometime between March 11-12, 1990 which resulted in the loss of government money in excess of P600,000, and made the following report:

- 1. You were assigned on duty at the Administration Building to take the 12-8 shift on March 12, 1990 morning but not to report at post at 1:00a.m.
- You admitted having lain at the sofa upstairs shortly after reporting at your post.
- 3. You admitted having heard dogs barking from somewhere in the direction of the lower campus but did not exert effort to find out the cause of the dog's unusual behavior.
- 4. You tried to mislead the Committee by saying you roved two (2) times at 12:00 midnight and at past 2:00 a.m. when you already admitted having reported at post at 1:00 a.m.
- 5. The break-in at the Cashier's Office occured between 8:15 p.m. of March 11, 1990 at 4:00 a.m. while your were on duty in the Building. from 12:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.

In view of the above, the Committee found you guilty of grave offense for inefficiency and incompetence in the performance of official duties, particularly for lying down on a sofa with sign of napping while on duty. As a security guard you are supposed to be alert and watchful of your surroundings particularly when you are securing a building with cash in it.

For humanitarian reason, I am imposing on you the minimum penalty for the offense - suspension without pay for 6 months and one (1) day - effective October 22, 1990.
