R E : Fare System and Routes for "Tuyok" (VSU Transport Loop System)

The four (4) vehicles of the "Tuyok" Transport Loop System in the campus started its operation last April 2018. It has since then facilitated mobility and connectivity to primary hubs, classrooms and offices without sacrificing public safety and welfare.

Operating the transport loop system incurs maintenance costs for fuel, lubricants, tires as well as wear and tear of its engine and other components. To address this cost and ensure road worthiness of the vehicles, a collection system involving season cards was proposed by the VSU Administration and approved by the VSU Board of Regents through BOR Resolution No. 20 s. 2018.

Season cards can be purchased for Two Hundred Pesos (P200.00) each at the Cash Division. Each card is valid for unlimited use within one (1) month from the date of purchase. The card has to be shown to the driver for inspection/validation prior to boarding.

The specific routes and stops of the Tuyok units are as follows:

- Route 1: Pavilion, Beach Resort, Infirmary, Guard Post 1&2, Research Centers, Forestry, COE, Pavilion
- Route 2: Pavilion, Tennis Court, Apartment, Balay Alumni, Guard Post 1&2, DLABS, Admin, CVM, Pavilion
- Route 3: Pavilion, Bachelor/Market, Balay Alumni, Guard Post 1&2, Admin, CVM, Pavilion
- Route 4: Pavilion, Tennis Court, Balay Alumni, Guard Post 1&2, Library, PCC, DAS, IHK, Pavilion

The "Tuyok" units are set to operate daily with the following schedules: (a) 6:30AM-8:30am; (b) 11:00am-12nn; (c) 12:30pm-1:30pm; & (d) 4:30pm-5:30pm.

Please be guided accordingly.
