
RE: **Memorandum from the CHED Chairman regarding postponement of opening of classes in the college level from June 8, 2009 to June 15, 2009**

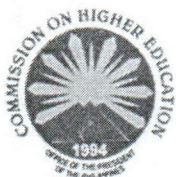
Please be informed that CHED Chairman Emmanuel Y. Angeles issued a Memorandum to all HEIs Heads, SUCs Heads and CHED Regional Directors dated June 5, 2009 postponing the opening of classes in the college level from June 8, 2009 to June 15, 2009 (please see attached sheet).

Therefore, in compliance with the said memorandum, all classes are cancelled starting June 9 until June 11, 2009. Today is the orientation for new students and regular class for continuing students. Regular Classes will resume on June 15, 2009 (Monday).

In lieu of the cancelled class days from VSU's BOR-approved academic calendar for SY 2009-2010, we are extending the classes of the First Semester up to October 14, 2009.

**SUBJECT** : Postponement of the opening of classes in the college level  
from June 8, 2009 to **June 15, 2009**

Please be informed that the Commission on Higher Education is hereby postponing the opening of classes in the tertiary level from June 8, 2009 to June 15, 2009 due to the following:

1. Many foreign students studying in the Philippines are still coming in, in time for the opening of classes. Some of them have come from countries where there are confirmed A(H1N1) cases, thus, the rescheduling of the class opening will give them time to self-quarantine;
2. The inclement weather being experienced in the country now has caused street flooding, and traffic congestion which is not conducive for both the students and the higher education institutions relative to the opening of the school year; and
3. It has been observed that most parents are not yet financially ready for the opening of classes for SY 2009-2010. This rescheduling will give them ample time to prepare and look for some other resources to enable them to send their children back to school
