R E: Pasturing of Animals (Carabaos and Goats) Inside the
Campus


It has been observed that carabaos and goats are being pastured inside the campus and along the highways traversing the campus. In several instances, the animals have destroyed the tree guards and the tree seedlings in them. Moreover, the carabaos are allowed to wallow in the drainage canals, destroying them and preventing free flow of water.

Much expenses have been incurred in maintaining these trees besides the cost of the seedlings and the time used up in caring for them. Yet, the owners of these animals do not mind the damages being caused by their animals.

In view of these destructions, those concerned are hereby advised that effective immediately, no animals should be tied to the fence to pasture or wallow in the drainage canals, nor they be allowed to roam freely on the campus. The owners or caretakers will be responsible for them hence, any cost of damage done by these animals in the campus will be charged to the former, accordingly.

Effective January 16, 1993 the Security Guards, VEAM members, ECOWARDENS and concerned VISCA staff who shall catch animals destroying plants and fences along the highway and on the campus will impound the animals until said destruction is restored by the owner/caretaker. In the event that no owner will claim the animals within 48 hours, the animals will be turned over to VEAM which may dispose the animals as it deem proper.
