MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 108

T O: Faculty, Staff, Students, Market Vendors, Visitors
R E: Implementation of the Clean-As-You-Go (CLAYGO) Policy

Recently, we have observed that users who bring food at the Eco-Park, Molave Hill, river, beach, sports facilities, walkways, and offices just leave their garbage instead of taking an extra effort to clean or pick up their litter.

At the university, one of our core values is excellence, and we believe this should be evident in general cleanliness and concern for the surroundings—whether in the workplace, market, school canteens, food stalls, buildings, comfort and restrooms, and activity centers.

Starting today, VSU shall officially adopt a CLAYGO or Clean-As-You-Go policy.

In line with this policy, all faculty, staff, students and store owners, proprietors, and managers of food stalls, cafeteria, eateries, bakeries, canteens, food outlets, groceries, recreational and sports facilities and all similar establishments in the university campus will be required to initiate and institutionalize measures within their establishments to encourage the practice of “clean as you go” by all concerned.

Moreover, the university shall strictly implement the following guidelines:


1. All students, faculty, staff and stakeholders are hereby directed to refrain from using single-use plastic containers/utensils, including plastic/cup, plastic bags/cellophanes, polystyrene containers (Styrofoam), cutlery and other plastic materials as food containers or wrappers, **and all shall set an example by using reusable utensils, water tumblers, and food containers to avoid incidents of contamination;**
2. Garbage bins shall be properly labeled for recycling and proper segregation of garbage and waste disposal;
3. In school canteens, food stalls, and fast-food chains, customers shall bring their utensils to a designated area after eating, leaving only the service crew to wipe or sanitize the tables. It is encouraged that food stalls will use color-coded utensils for the clients to properly deposit or pile up the used eating materials.
4. All faculty, staff, students, residents, market vendors, and visitors are mandated to use eco-bags and other alternative packaging materials to pack groceries, food, and other goods every day. (*OP MC NO. 44, Series of 2021 and Baybay City Ordinance NO. 007, Series of 2013*)

These best practices are our little way of showing how we care for our environment and human health. Instead of relying entirely on our utility staff or cleaners, we should at least make an effort on cleaning up after our own mess.

Depending on the nature of the offense, violators will be directed to render community service of 8 to 16 hours.

This memo hereby updates of previous pronouncements by the university related to this policy.

- R E: Implementation of Baybay City Ordinance on Plastic Bag Reduction**

Pursuant to the Baybay City Plastic Bag Reduction Ordinance No. 007, S. 2013, otherwise called the "Plastic Bag Reduction Ordinance", with its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) to govern the reduction on the use of plastic bags for **two (2) days each week** in the City of Baybay, the VSU Waste Management and Pollution Control Committee (WMPCC), thru the Chairman, Dr. Eliza D. Espinosa, is requesting everyone's participation to its implementation. Beginning May 4, 2021, all **Tuesdays and Saturdays** are declared "**Environment-Friendly Days**" in Baybay City as stated in the IRR. To reduce the use of plastics, it is mandatory to use eco-bags and other alternative packaging materials to pack groceries, foods and other goods during these days. Further, in the IRR all stores are mandated to provide their own reusable container for wet goods/or require its customers to bring their own reusable container for the same.
