I. ROLL CALL

President Jose L. Bacusmo, inquired from the University Secretary whether there
was a quorum of UADCO members present for the meeting.

The University Secretary informed the President, that there was a quorum of UADCO members present for the 111th UADCO meeting.

II. CALL TO ORDER

President Jose L. Bacusmo welcomed all UADCO members to the meeting and called the meeting to order at 8:31 A.M. after ascertaining that there was a quorum.

III. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The President informed the Council that this is his first meeting after the medical episode last September which was caused by the confluence of stress and high blood sugar. The President indicted that he is now again subjected to stress on account of making decisions on how to spend the existing rehabilitation funds which had been deposited with the University end of July-September, before the end of the year, as this will have an impact on the PBB next year. Last year, VSU had a Fund Utilization of only 70% - but we got saved by "Yolanda". So, despite this low utilization, VSU was still given PBB. This year (2014), we have to have a better Fund Utilization rate so that we can be given PBB. Another problem is how to get the almost P7.0 million that the University spent for immediate repairs of damaged infrastructure reimbursed.

The President then informed the Council that he had designated Dr. Victor B. Asio, erstwhile Dean of the College of Agriculture and Head of the Department of Soil Science, as the new Vice President for Planning and Resource Generation. The President indicated that he already issued the appointment. In the meantime, Dr. Asio will also be taking care of the International Affairs and Networks Office and will still be in-charge of the Erasmus Mundos program as well as the DOST Science consortium.

As a consequence of Dr. Asio's reposting, the VP for Instruction will be meeting with the department heads of the College of Agriculture to select the next College Dean as well as a replacement Department Head.

The President also informed the Council that Dr. Lourdes B. Cano was elected President of the Human Resource Management Officers during the Visayas Congress of Human Resource Management Practitioners.

Finally, the President congratulated the Deans of the Alangalang and Villaba Campuses for having successfully underwent Level 1 accreditation of some of their academic programs. For the VSU Alangalang, the following programs were Level 1 accredited: Bachelor in Elementary Education; Bachelor of Secondary Education with major in Mathematics, and Bachelor of Science in Environmental Management. For the VSU Villaba, the following programs were accredited: Bachelor in Elementary Education; Bachelor of Secondary Education with majors in English, Mathematics, and Biological Science; and the Bachelor of Science in Agriculture.

Dean Marichu M. Padayao informed the President and the Council that only the DAT-BAT program was not subjected to accreditation.

The President pointed out that there is really a need to rethink the offering of the DAT-BAT because of the K-12 program has a stream that will parallel this. Probably, VSU Alangalang will revert back to the BS Agriculture program.

The President informed the Council that some of the Security Guards were found to have submitted fake licenses and one of the guards was guilty of the same infraction sometime in 2006. This particular guard has been advised to resign or be charged with Falsification of Official Documents. This is a more humane way out for this guard as he can still work in other government office or in private establishments.

The President also mentioned about planning the Candle Lighting Ceremony to officially start the Christmas Season in the University as well as the University Christmas Party.

The President reminded the Council to inform their respective staff to maintain cleanliness in their surroundings to help eliminate mosquitoes which have spawned a string of dengue cases inside the campus. The dengue cases were reported in the area where Mr. Raul Abit and Mrs. Calunangan live, just a stone's throw away from the fishpond at the back of the ATI. The banana plants should be regularly prunes to prevent stagnant water to

1	be embedded in between the bracts and where the mosquitoes may breed. For this time,
2	employees will be permitted to burn their trash to ward off these mosquitoes.
3	Finally, the President informed the Council that the BOR Meeting will be held in the
4	CHED Central Office in Quezon City on 03 December 2014.

Integration of DCDE to the College of Agriculture: 36 The President indicated that the Department is still encountering problems 37 regarding their present name since the department cannot be accredited under the

College of Agriculture unless their name is aligned with agriculture and no longer with education following the existing CMO for Agriculture.

2. Construction of Olympic-Sized Pool:

5 .

The President indicated that the Board of Regents approved the allocation of P7.0 million for the construction of the Olympic-sized pool. Engr. Ramil Lauron and Engr. Nestor Israel went to the Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) to know the "standards" associated with having an Olympic-sized pool. They quickly learned that the present location, built on a East-West orientation, is not recommended since the sunrise and sunset will be very glaring to the eyes of the swimmers. The recommended orientation is North-South. The problem now is where the pool will be located utilizing a North-South orientation. The University engineers are now looking for the most appropriate location.

3. Biodiversity Museum:

The President indicated the Board of Regents approved the allocation of P2.0 million for the rehabilitation of the old FORI building. There is a need to come up with a more comprehensive plan for the area including the improvement of the road system (concreting) and the construction of a perimeter fence around the building to secure it.

4. Squatters in University Lands (All Campuses):

The President requested for an update from the University Legal Counsel, Atty.

Rysan C. Guinocor, regarding this very important matter.

Atty. Guinocor informed the Council that after presenting the University's proposal to the Office of the Solicitor General, said Office was against the proposal to rent out the lands to squatters as this might later be the source of many legal problems to the University. In the case of CMU or even MSU, where the University rented-out lands, the government took back the unused lands that were rented out. The SolGen also indicated that there might also be problems with the COA if this is implemented.

Atty. Guinocor indicated that the SolGen suggested that the University provide the OSG a list of names of the squatters so that the OSG will try to help evict these squatters.

The President cautioned all the Deans including those in the Main Campus to refrain from permitting faculty or other employees from setting up housing within campus because it will be very difficult to ask them to leave like in UEP. And if they do agree to leave, these people will destroy everything, house and fence, just so that no one else can make use of whatever structure was built.

Dr. Ma. Juliet C. Ceniza informed the Council that she would like to know what the University can do to those security guards who were permitted to build their own houses inside the campus because there is one who built his house very near the Coconut Demonstration Farm. This particular security guard is now renting out portion of the building he constructed to VSU students.

President Bacusmo replied that he is not aware of this situation where the security guards were given permission to build their own domiciles inside the campus. The President explained that he does not want a situation like other SUCs who have problems with private houses inside their campuses.

The President stressed that the existing policy of the University is to assign Security Guards to houses vacated by illegal settlers. The President mentioned that in the case of a certain Lino, this illegal occupant was evicted because his son was caught stealing by Mr. Marianito Modina. The same situation is true in the case of a certain Koro, whose son was also caught stealing. In both cases, these illegal settlers were evicted and Security Guards were assigned by the University to live in the vacated housing units. In the case of a certain Abosejo, his son died, and the old man left the place. In his stead, another Security guard was assigned to live in his house. The University wants to place Security Guards along the perimeter of the University properties to help guard these areas.

Dr. Ceniza mentioned that SG Geron, who lives near the copra dryer, has been expanding his house and has accepted "boarders".

President Bacusmo indicated that indeed, Mr. Jesus Geron is living in the house vacated by Lino, located near the copra dryer. The President requested Engr. Nestor

Lauzon reported that the Koreans will be given a brand-new vehicle 23 24 to the VSU Tolosa and that Dr. Lauzon has already made a choice. 25 The President also mentioned that the Koreans will be coming to the Main Campus on 02 December 2014 for a site visit and expect to receive quotations attendant 26 to the conduct of Geo-Technical Analysis of the soils within VSU Tolosa preparatory to 27

VII. NEW BUSINESS

1. Projected Income and Proposed Expenditure Program for CY 2015

The President requested the University Budget Officer, Ms. Anita Godoy, to make the presentation.

Ms. Godoy clarified that what is requested for BOR approval is the 2015 Budget for Fund 164 (Special Trust Fund) across campuses amounting to P124,719,000.00. The sources of fund includes tuition, other school fees, fiduciary fees, service and business income. Ms. Godoy pointed out that the projected income (Annex A) is based on historical records. The breakdown of the budget per allotment and per campus is presented in Annex B and C, respectively, to wit:

3. The Grant of CNA Incentive for 2014

The President requested the University Budget Officer, Ms. Anita Godoy, to make the presentation.

Ms. Godoy clarified that the proposal is for the Board of Regents to approve the grant of Collective Negotiations Agreement (CNA) incentives to all qualified VSU employees in the amount of P16,000.00 each or a total budgetary requirement of P13,984,000.00 for the whole VSU system sourced from savings. The amount of savings for each expense item is computed by deducting the obligations incurred as of 31 October 2014 and the allocation for each expense item. The sources of savings are the six (6) main MOOE items, namely: *Travel*, *Communications*, *Repairs and Maintenance*, *Transportation and Delivery*, *Supplies and Materials*, and *Utility Expenses*.

Ms. Godoy pointed out that the legal basis for the grant of this CNA incentive is DBM Budget Circular No. 2013-4 dated 25 November 2013 while awaiting the 2014 DBM Guidelines. The breakdown of the CNA budgetary requirement by campus is as follows:

Dr. Othello B. Capuno inquired whether the University can increase the amount of CNA incentive considering that the University still has a considerable amount of savings.

The President replied that the University has to balance the utilization of savings with other needs of the University like the upkeep of the facilities. In other SUCs, the employees get fat CNAs and bonuses but the upkeep of their school facilities is left behind. The President also clarified that although the CNA incentive is P16,000 each, only P15,000 will be given since the P1,000 will be for the partial payment of the P5,000.00 disallowance ruled by the COA.

	31	designated as part-time principal of the school. At present, VSU is prohibited by COA
	32	from sharing University income from the coconut project with VEFI. Thus, VSU will be
	33	hard pressed on hiring on a full-time basis, a principal who will supervise the academic
	34	performance of the VFES. The University will stick to its policy of designating ar

existing faculty, on a part-time basis, to act as Principal of VFES.

The University Secretary informed the Council that as of the present time, there is no longer a valid MOA between VSU and VEFI as this has long expired.

Dr. Victor B. Asio suggested that the VEFI Board should consider designating from among the most senior teachers to serve as Principal.

President Bacusmo indicated that he will meet the VEFI Board of Directors and discuss this with them.

6. Promotion of Engr. Celso V. Gumaod

The President informed the Council that the position of Engr. Gumaod is with the General Services Division (GSD). He is just designated as Head of Security and he may opt not to accept the promotion. The President mentioned that Engr. Gumaod has been "left behind" in terms of promotion by the other GSD engineers. The University will be hard pressed in looking for another person to head Security.

The President mentioned that with the promotion, Engr. Gumaod will be encouraged to strive to do his best in providing security within the Main Campus given the size of the whole campus.

Dr. Beatriz S. Belonias commented that she is very alarmed about the dishonesty exhibited by some security guards and mentioned her laptop experience as well as the submission of fake licenses by some of the security guards.

The President indicated that those caught with fake licenses have been given a final warning that a repetition of this will mean separation from service. The University has also instituted stricter measures so that this will not happen again.

Atty. Guinocor inquired whether the promotion will mean that the other Security Guards of the other campuses will now be under Engr. Gumaod considering that the position used to be that of the Records Officer. Atty. Guinocor clarified that when Mr. Simeon Sedrome occupied the position of Supervising Administrative Officer (as University Records Officer) all other Records Offices within the VSU System was directly under him.

The University Secretary replied that in this case, the Supervising Administrative Position (Chief of Security) will only cover the Main Campus because of the size and security challenges here in the Main Campus.

The University Secretary also mentioned that there has to be a way of reducing if not totally preventing the entry of motorcycles with modified mufflers as the sound emitted by a motorcycle exhaust system is very disturbing especially when these motorcycles roam around the campus at night and during weekends. The University Secretary narrated that the Cebu City Council has passed a City Ordinance prohibiting motorcycles with modified mufflers from plying the city streets. The ordinance specified that the sound level, at full throttle, should not exceed 85 decibels.

The President commented that there has to be a way of measuring the sound level so that we can definitely say it has exceeded the maximum sound level permitted inside the campus. Otherwise, it will just lead to heated arguments.

Dr. Luz O. Moreno mentioned the half open gates along the Guard Posts which sometimes is accident prone especially that many employees have purchased vehicles resulting in much heavier gate traffic. The numerous vehicles have also spawned parking problems in the Apartment area on account of double parking of vehicles which choke the narrow streets of the area.

The President indicated that there is a need to instruct the Guard-On-Duty to open the gate a bit more to facilitate the flow of traffic.

Prof. Alan B. Loreto mentioned that probably, the gates should normally be closed so that the Guard-On-Duty will be forced to make an inspection of all incoming vehicles before they enter the gate. Prof. Loreto likewise mentioned that during weekends and holidays, when only one gate is used for entry and exit, the vehicle entering the campus has the "right-of-way" but is made to "give-way" to vehicles exiting the campus, which is wrong. This needs to be corrected.

President Bacusmo indicated that based on the World Bank plans, an "overpass" should have been constructed to safely cross the national highway. However, this overpass will be quite unsightly and will be very expensive to build. This will be for the

1	future presidents to consider building, funds permitting. The President inquired from
2	Engr. Nestor Israel which is cheaper to do: a) extend the Guard Post forward; or b) move
3	the Gate forward.
4	Engr. Israel replied that for both options, the cost will not be that much and both
5	can be easily done. What needs to be done now is to find a way of facilitating entry and
6	exit of vehicles given the existing structures.
7	The President pointed out that if we can only place two (2) guards to man the
8	Gates, there will be no problem. However, due to lack of manpower, we have to find
9	ways of solving this problem without depleting our manpower.
10	Mr. Eliezer L. Velasco commented that he suggested to Engr. Gumaod sometime
11	back that if the Tolosa Campus can send some BS Criminology students for OJT, the
12	students can help traffic in the national highway which gets very busy when employees
13	go home in the afternoon, between 5:00 PM and 6:00 PM.
14	The President indicated that on account of the many problems hounding security
15	including ensuring smooth traffic in the national highway, he will meet with the security
16	unit to help map out strategies on how best to deal with various security concerns.
17	Dr. Othello B. Capuno moved for the approval of the promotion of Engr. Celso

4. Proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Between the Oklahoma State University (OSU) and the Visayas State University (VSU)

Dr. Victor B. Asio informed the Council that Dr. Sergio Abit, Asst. Professor, OSU has communicated with his office regarding the possibility of establishing official academic ties through a Memorandum of Understanding between the two universities. Dr. Abit also sent a *pro forma* MOU for our consideration and that this has been transmitted to the Office of the University Legal Counsel for comments. In addition to this proposed MOU, there are also specific agreements with the College of Agriculture and Natural Science of OSU under the General MOA to be signed. Once the MOU/MOA is approved, the VSU can select students who want to serve as "interns" of some professors at OSU and will be paid for their services by the professors they are assigned to. Later, there will be some "faculty exchange". The OSU has an existing MOU/MOU with UPLB and outside of UPLB, if this MOU/MOA is approved, then

VSU will be the first SUC outside of UPLB to have a MOA with a North American University.

President Bacusmo pointed out that ViSCA had a lot of tie-ups with North American Universities, but that most of these have expired and have not been renewed. This is high time that VSU re-engage with North American Universities to further faculty/student exchanges as well as research and development exchanges.

5. Communication from the University of Niño, Portugal

Dr. Victor B. Asio informed the Council that the University of Niño, Portugal communicated with his office informing us that they would like to partner with VSUs College of Engineering. The University of Niño is part of our area partnership under the Erasmus Mundos.

The President requested Dr. Asio to provide a copy to Atty. Guinocor for review.

6. University Website

Dr. Victor B. Asio suggested about the need to improve the management of the VSU website because it has very little content. A foreign student contacted Dr. Antonio P. Abamo regarding his interest in coming over as an exchange student under the Erasmus Mundos program. He wanted information about courses offered here so he could decide which courses to enroll in. Sad to say, this interested foreign student decided not to pursue his studies in VSU because of the dearth of information in its website.

President Bacusmo informed the Council that Mr. Norman Villas is the person in-charge of the University's website. According to Mr. Jed Cortes, the design of the website requires bigger memory on the part of the person downloading. Thus, when a cellphone is used to access and download, the contents cannot be displayed. However, if a regular computer is used, the web contents will be easily displayed. Nonetheless, because of the many issues raised, the President indicated that he will meet with Norman what is the present situation, the problems of running it and also to discuss how best to improve VSUs webpage.

Dr. Asio narrated that the webpage of the College of Agriculture, while it is also linked to the University webpage, is hosted by a private entity and not the University itself. The College of Agriculture pays a monthly fee for this service.

Prof. Alan B. Loreto informed the Council that in the past, the VSU website was managed by him, Engr. Tabada and Mr. Dale Loreto. The program used then is different from what is now used. However, Mr. Jed Cortes and Mr. Norman Villas got assigned to maintain the webpage, they migrated to another system and changed the program platform to Word Press. It was during the migration process when a lot of the encrypted contents were lost.

The President mentioned that one of the problems of the University is poor communication facilities between the units. Hopefully, this issue can also be discussed in the meeting.

Dr. Belonias commented that one of the problems faced in maintaining the website is the need to constantly update the contents of the website. This means that there should be "department-based correspondents" who will provide the needed updates to the web managers. As of the moment, updates are based only on what is available in the Obelisk. Unfortunately, the Obelisk is not produced regularly and comes out very late meaning, its contents are dated.

7. Installation of a Globelines Phone in each of the Guard Posts

President Bacsumo informed the Council that he will be requesting that Globe lines phones be made available to the two (2) Guard Posts. The phone numbers of a landline are very few compare to that of a cellphone.

8. Level 4 AACCUP Accreditation of the BS Agribusiness and B Animal Science

Dr. Beatriz S. Belonias reminded the Deans and members of the Council that the BS Agribusiness and the B Animal Science are due for a 4th Level AACCUP Accreditation visit starting 24-29 November 2014. Faculty should be reminded to hold regular classes especially during these dates since the accreditors might actually visit classes.

Attendant to this, Dr. Belonias requested that the President issue an advisory to the effect that key officials of the University will not travel while the accreditation is ongoing since some of them may be interviewed by the accreditors.

The President mentioned that there is another accreditation coming, the Institutional Sustainability Assessment (ISA). VSU will go for ISO assessment only if there will be any budgetary implication because this is an expensive process. If there will be no budgetary implication, VSU will not vie for ISO assessment.

9. Awarding of the Certificate of Accreditation from the Civil Service Commission

President Bacusmo informed the Council that under the PRIME HRM program of the CSC, VSU passed the assessment under the said program and will be awarded the Certificate of Accreditation by Dir. Farida Q. Aurelia on 24 November 2014. All UADCO members are invited to attend and witness the awarding.

10. Assignment of Classrooms by the University Registrar's Office

because

Dr. Luz O. Moreno requested the University Registrar to carefully go over the assignment of classrooms considering the number of students and the type of class. Dr. Moreno narrated that her class in AgSc. 114 has 105/106 registered students but the room assigned for this class – Dept. of Hort. Rm. 101, is too small for the class. This has resulted in some missed classes while looking for a bigger room. It just so happened that there is the DASS auditorium, which is big enough for the class, but the students complained because the said room is available only at a 12PM-1PM schedule since the students have classes before and after this schedule. She further narrated that she instructed her students to bring food as there is no other room big enough for the whole class. Dr. Moreno inquired why large classes are given small rooms that cannot accommodate the whole class. Is this practice now the standard?

Mr. Eliezer Velasco, University Registrar, explained that indeed the University is running short of classrooms, both large and small classrooms. During the time when ViSCA had only 2,000 students, all the classrooms were all utilized. Now that the University enrollment has more than doubled, the number of classrooms has remained

1 the same. There is an urgent need to build more and much bigger classrooms to accommodate more students and bigger class sizes. 2 3 The President indicated that he will take note of this. The president pointed out 4 that once the Main Library transfers to the new location, the vacated building will be converted to new classrooms. There is also a plan to transfer the COA from that place to 5 the Materials Recovery Building after construction is completed. 6 11. Processing for the 6th Cycle of NBC 461 7 8 Dr. Moreno requested that Administration issue the necessary guidelines so that the faculty can start preparing their documents for the period July 2010 to June 2013. 9 The earlier this is done the better since it take from 5 to 6 years before the points earned 10 for the period are realized as promotion. 11 12. Hosting the 2016 AAACU Meeting here in VSU 12 13 President Bacusmo informed the Council that the University has been awarded 14 the right to host the 2016 meeting of the Association of Asian Agricultural Colleges and Universities (AAACU). This year, the meeting will be held in one of the external 15 campuses of Kasetsart University (KU), Thailand which is some distance from Bangkok. 16 17 This is one of the big external campuses of the KU. Some VSU personnel will attend this especially because at this time in 2016, another President shall be at the helm of 18 19 VSU. 20 IX. ADJOURNMENT After all items were discussed, President Jose L.
