30		President Tulin indicated that almost all have been implemented.					
31		A short discussion related to the award of permanency to Dr. Karen Teves was

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Chairperson Bautista suggested to Pres. Tulin that it is now time for the University to come up with implementing guidelines related to lateral (solicited) entry of faculty vis-à-vis the ranking system that will be used. In this light, BOR Resolution No. 80, s. 2008 needs to be revisited to include lateral entry. There is also a need to speed-up the process of giving tenure to faculty.

The Hon. Chair also suggested to the President to go slow on "scrap and build" of higher faculty positions - Professor and Associate Professor positions - since there are a lot of lower level items that will be distributed to all SUCs. For VSU, 110 Instructor I positions will be given.

VI. **CHAIRPERSON'S TIME**

The Hon. Chairperson, Commissioner Maria Cynthia Rose B. Bautista, informed the Board that during the Senate Hearing, the CHED expressed its reservations on the Senate proposal to "provide free tuition to all students in SUCs."

In essence, the CHED pointed out the following points:

- 1. the individual (student) benefits, so the individual should share in the cost. The student population is composed of both poor and not poor. However, if a student is cash strapped and in very difficult financial conditions, it is the duty of the state to fully subsidize these kinds of students only.
- 2. the proposal is not sustainable. The cost of education is ever increasing meaning that the government will have to keep on increasing its subsidy budget in the years to come until it may no longer be able to support this considering that those in the private sector will transfer to SUCs to avail of the free tuition privilege.
- 3. the proposal will probably devastate Private HEIs, even the really good ones; and
- 4. the proposal is regressive. It is a fact that in the current system, roughly 27% of total student enrolment in SUCs come from the Top 20% income earners of the population while only 8% of the total student enrolment come from the Lowest 20% income earners of the population.

Chairperson Bautista emphasized that based on empirical studies, there is no statistical correlation between being an SUC and reaching the poor. Further, the Philippines lags behind other countries in Southeast Asia (SEA) in terms of government investment in Higher Education, as follows:

Cambodia - US\$ 500 per person in Higher Education

Cambodia	- US\$ 500 per person in Higher Education
Philippines	- US\$ 548 per person in Higher Education
Vietnam	- US\$ 1,350 per person in Higher Education
Thailand	- US\$ 1,800 per person in Higher Education
Malaysia	- US\$ 9,000 per person in Higher Education
Singapore	- US\$ 16,000 per person in Higher Education

The Hon. Chair pointed out that this rather low investment in human capital accounts for why on most indicators on higher education, the Philippines ranked extremely low. There is still hope, though but the Philippines needs to get its act together. What the CHED is against is on the proposed Senate Bill granting Free Tuition for All in SUCs but not on government investments in SUCs.

VII. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Tulin indicated that he will present only the highlights for the period: Institutional:

- Signed a MOA with the CHED last 31 October 2015 on the study related to the establishment of a University System for Eastern Visayas to include: benchmarking assessment; social marketing of the proposed University System in all SUCs;
- 2. Attended the Faculty Development Plan for K to 12 and submitted all the requirements attendant to faculty development under this K to 12 program;
- 3. The College of Engineering and the Human Resource Office submitted themselves for ISO 9000 certification for processes/services of the University as well as support services of the College of Engineering laboratory;
- 4. Yale University awarded VSU with a Certificate of Recognition for "Environmental Leadership and Training Initiative; and
- 5. Dr. Roberto C. Guarte received the CSC Presidential Lingkod Bayan Award.

The expected receipts from the 2016 Special Trust Funds (STF) amount to P128,893,000.00. The utilization of this expected income in 2016 include the funding of some of the priority projects of Pres. Tulin, as follows: (a) interconnectivity – P3.9

mil; (b) internet leased line - P107,000.00 per month for one (1) year; (c) installation of biometric equipment in all offices in the Main Campus - P750,000.00; (d) deployment of locally manufactured biodiesel jeepneys for the transport loop around 3 the Main Campus - P1.0 million; and other expenses as indicated in Tab E3. Regent Uy informed the Board that the BOR Finance Committee deliberated on the proposal, found it to be in order and is recommended it for approval by the Governing Board. Details of the proposal are presented in Table E6.

Regent Uy informed the Board that the Committee requested Administration to check whether the University is covered under the on-going program of the DOST to connect government offices in the Region through fiber optics.

Chairperson Bautista inquired how long is the contract for the 15 mbps leasedline with the University.

Pres. Tulin indicated that the contract is renewable yearly.

The Hon. Chair indicated that if the University is included in the DOST fiber optics program, it will have to give-up the leased-line contract once the yearly contract ends.

No questions were raised.

The Board unanimously passed

BOR RESOLUTION NO. 99, s. 2015

A Resolution approving the proposal to avail of a 15 mbps Leased-Line (E-1), as proposed, provided that if the University will be included in the DOST fiber optic program the leased-line contract will not be renewed and subject to requirements set forth in RA 9184.

7. Proposal for Funding Allocation to Pay the 2014 Publications Incentive

Regent Uy informed the Board that the BOR Finance Committee deliberated on the proposal, found it to be in order and is recommended it for approval by the Governing Board. Details of the proposal are presented in Table E7.

The Hon. Chair commented that based on the proposal, for International SSI publication, an author will be paid P25,000 per publication while for International non-ISI publication, an author will be paid P7,000 per publication. For 2014, one (1) author was able to publish in an International ISI; forty (40) were able to publish in International non-ISI; and 2 were able to publish an International Chapter.

Pres. Tulin indicated that the 2015 publications incentive will be given sometime in the later part of 2016.

Chairperson Bautista informed the two (2) private sector representatives that it usually takes about 2 years before an article submitted for publication gets printed and it is for this reason that the University pays a substantial amount of money to those faculty who succeed.

No questions were raised.

The Board unanimously passed

BOR RESOLUTION NO. 100, s. 2015

A Resolution approving the proposal for funding allocation to pay the 2014 Publications Incentive, as proposed.

8. Proposed VSU Intellectual Property (IP) Protection Incentive Program

Regent Uy informed the Board that the BOR Finance Committee deliberated on the proposal, found it to be in order and is recommended it for approval by the Governing Board. Details of the proposal are presented in Table E8.

President Tulin informed the Board that the University has, at present, an Intellectual Property Handbook but we do not have an incentive scheme for individuals or researchers who will be able to generate patents, copyrights, trademarks, creative works or utility model.

Chairperson Bautista inquired how much is the proposed incentive.

President Tulin indicated that upon submission of copyrightable material, an individual gets P5,000. For a utility model, an individual gets P25,000, given in installments, plus a Certificate. In case of a Patent, an individual gets as much as P50,000, also given in installments, plus a Certificate.

No questions were raised.

The Board unanimously passed

C. Academic Matters

1.	Revised	School	Cal	lendar

President Tulin informed the Board that the revision of the school calendar for 2016 is a consequence of moving the start of classes from June to August. The proposal was approved by both the academic and Administrative Councils. Classes will start on 01 August 2016 and end by 29 November. The 2nd semester will start on 09 January 2017 until 12 May 2017. For the next school year, VSU expects only about 200 freshmen students. However, there will be additional Grade 11 students who will enroll.

The President pointed out that due to the August opening of the 1st semester, there will be a second summer program that will be offered which will be used as a remedial summer program to enable the students to catch-up with subjects they have either missed enrolling-in in the regular semesters or have failed altogether.

Chairperson Bautista clarified that the Board has already approved the school calendar for SY 2016-2017 in the previous BOR meeting.

No questions were raised.

The Board unanimously passed

President Tulin informed the Board that for the duration of his travel to Australia, he would like to designate Dr. Remberto A. Patindo, VP for Instruction, to be the Officer-In-Charge of the University.

No questions were raised.

The Board unanimously passed

D. Administrative Matters

1. <u>Proposal to Grant Study Leave with Pay to VSU Faculty Members Pursuing Master's Degree without external Scholarships from SY 2016-2017 until SY 2020-2021</u>

President Tulin explained to the Board that this proposal emanated from the Council of Deans of the University. In essence, the proposal seeks to address the problem faced by some faculty members who have remained part-time teachers because they could not complete their Master's degrees because they have to work and they have not been able to secure external scholarships. The Council of Deans believe that by giving them their salaries while they pursue their Master's degrees, they have a very good change at completing their degrees within the prescribed period.

President Tulin emphasized that in order that this privilege will not be abused, there are some conditions in order for qualified faculty to avail this privilege. Some of the provisions include: (1) "they cannot reinstate unless they have completed their studies"; and (2) "they can only pursue degrees in line with the faculty development program of the University."

Chairperson Bautista clarified that during the five (5) year transition period for the K to 12, there will be faculty members who will be on full-time study leave with pay except that they will not be provided with tuition and other support. Maybe,

they can avail of CHED fellowships or scholarships just so they can finish their Master's degrees.

President Tulin indicated that this special privilege will end immediately after the transition period of the K to 12 program is over in SY 2010-2021.

Chairperson Bautista mentioned that the proposal really seeks to extend supporting more faculty than what scholarship funds can support by providing them with their salaries and in return the faculty are given the chance to complete their degrees.

No questions were raised.

The Board unanimously passed

BOR RESOLUTION NO. 105, s. 2015

- d) Upgrading of Ms. Alicia M. Flores from Administrative Officer II (SG-11) to Administrative Officer III (SG-15)

The Student Regent, Mr. Dexter Relevo, indicated that he would like to make a comment regarding the proposed upgrading.

Regent Relevo informed the Board that he was present in the University Administrative Council (UAdCO) meeting. The Student Regent stated that he was made to understand that in the upgrading process, instead of choosing from among the most qualified employees, the Human Resource Management Office (HRMO) of the University just recommends a person or group of persons for a higher position. During the rounds made by the USSC in the different campuses,

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many administrative workers kept inquiring why this person is being fast-tracked for promotion when there are a lot of other more qualified administrative staff who have not been promoted for quite a long time.

Chairperson Bautista requested some clarification from Administration regarding this negative perception as relayed by the Student Regent.

President Tulin informed the Board that the original proposal presented during the UAdCO meeting was for upgrading of Ms. Flores from Administrative Office II (SG-11) to Administrative Officer V (SG-18). The main reason for this huge leap in rank was the new DBM Circular in which new positions intended for the Supply and Procurement Office. One of the positions indicated in the DBM Circular is the position of Supply Officer with a salary grade of 18. The members of the UAdCO objected to the proposal on the ground that Ms. Flores was just designated in the Supply Office last February 2015 and barely a few months later, she is being upgraded to a position with salary grade 18. It is a fact that there are a lot of other qualified administrative employees who were by-passed, so to speak. It was the decision of the UAdCO to lower the salary grade to 15 to make it at par with other administrative workers.

Regent Relevo commented that because of this rather surprising move by the HRMO has caused a lot of demoralization among other administrative staff who feel that administration is playing favorites. This demoralization has caused the "negative feelings" which have also affected how they deal with the students.

Chairperson Bautista clarified that this is a managerial question and not one for the Board to handle. Administration should tackle the issues raised and make a decision. There is a need to discuss this issue more extensively with the concerned administrative workers before it will be referred back to the Board.

President Tulin was amenable to the suggestion of Chairperson Bautista.

e) Proposed Memorandum of Understanding with Florida International University

President Tulin informed the Board that this MOU was endorsed by the CHED for consideration by the University. Basically, this MOU deals with collaboration between the VSU and FIU on research, education and/or training opportunities on climate change, specifically in the following areas: (a) extreme weather events modeling and training; (b) typhoon and storm surge research; (c) disaster risk reduction; and (d) resilience enhancement. However, aside from this proposed MOU, no other details have been provided by the CHED.

Chairperson Bautista indicated that she will look into this and that for the moment, this proposed MOU with the Florida International University will be for further study.

F. Other Matters

1. Claire Larzen Tello Case

The Hon. Chairperson informed the Board that there is a letter from former VSU President, Dr. Jose L. Bacusmo, which presents the recommendations of the Investigation Committee regarding the Tello case. This has to do with some money matters.

Chairperson Bautista, quoted from the letter, to wit: "The results of the investigation on Ms. Claire Tello for the VSU BOR's perusal. I agree that Balsy's credentials should be withheld until he has settled the P30,000 which he borrowed from the College of Agriculture Student Council. He is now employed in a private firm. He came to our residence to inform me that he is not forgetting his obligation. I also agree that Mr. Bryan Bahandi should be made to render an audited financial report of the USSC money during their term I agree that his credentials should be withheld until such time that he is able to render this report... In the case of Miss Claire Tello, I agree that her credentials will be withheld until such time she is able to reimburse the USSC of the P200,000 she borrowed from me, (and which) the

present USSC leadership is trying to pay. However, I disagree that she will be stripped of the honors (she received) as a graduate of VSU."

Chairperson Bautista commented that the withholding of credentials tantamount to withholding their graduation.

Regent Emmanuel De Guia inquired whether the Board has imposed any conditions for graduation which are also known by the students. Is there a document which contains these conditions which are approved by the Governing Board like a student manual or student handbook.

President Tulin explained that this is contained in the ViSCA Code as well as in the Student Handbook. Further, all students are required to file student clearance as a requirement prior to graduation. The Student Clearance is the legal and legitimate requirement which has to be accomplished by all prior to graduation. In short, if a student does not get a clearance, the student does not graduate.

Regent De Guia inquired whether the "loan contracted by Ms. Tello" can be considered a financial advance from the University or it is a personal loan.

Regent Relevo clarified that the money did not come from the University Supreme Student Council (USSC) as this was sourced from the ViSCA Foundation for Agricultural and Rural Development, Inc. (VIFARD), a semi-private foundation located within the University. President Jose L. Bacusmo borrowed the money from ViFARD which was then used by Ms. Tello to pay the 50% Talent Fee of the artists. However, Ms. Tello did this without the concurrence of the USSC.

Regent Bonifacio G. Uy inquired whether the clearances of the concerned students have these been issued or not.

The Board Secretary replied in the negative.

Regent Uy inquired whether the students in question were included in the list of candidates approved by the Governing Board and why the concerned students were allowed to march during the 2014 Graduation Ceremonies.

Regent Relevo explained that the list of candidates for graduation was presented for BOR approval early in March 2015. However, five (5) days before the

graduation date, the Administration called for a meeting with the parents. In that meeting, the parents of the concerned students agreed to the proposal that that the students be allowed to march during the graduation rites but that their credentials will be withheld until such time that the money will be paid in full as Ms. Tello could not pay the full amount. In the end, the graduating students were able to march without submitting a clearance but also unable to get their diploma and transcript of records.

The Board Secretary added that while all credentials from the University were withheld, Ms. Tello and another officer who graduated with *Latin* honors were able to receive their Civil Service Eligibility certificates attesting to the fact that they "graduated" with honors.

The Hon. Chairperson clarified that the University is now faced with a unique problem where we have students who have completed their academic program, then actually participated in the graduation march, but with no credentials released, but also received a Certificate from the Civil Service Commission conferring them government eligibility on account of their having graduated with *Latin* honors based on the Board approved list of Candidates for Graduation. The CSC gave them their eligibilities in good faith.

Regent Deogracias E. Pernitez suggested that this difficult problem be studied further and that the Governing Board should study the matter carefully.

Regent De Guia inquired whether the USSC has issued a statement regarding this issue.

Regent Relevo replied that former President Bacusmo created an Investigation Committee and it was this Committee that came up with the three (3) recommendations mentioned in the letter of Dr. Bacusmo.

Chairperson Bautista clarified since this is not a committee created by the Governing Board, the Board should create a small group to look into the investigation report and gather all the facts for the Board to understand all the issues. If it is possible, to look at possible similar cases for better appreciation of the facts that may be uncovered. But who will constitute this small group?
