

Regarding the report on the 5-year development plan for ViSCA,	6
Ms. Abella-Hife of HEDA inquired if the NEDA in the region was consulted	7
in the planning. The answer was on the affirmative. Dr. Suarez also	8
asked if the physical aspect has been included in the plan. Dr. Go	9
informed the Board that the 5-year development plan of Visca includes	10
all aspects.	11
For the benefit of Ms. Abella-Hife who is new in the Board, Hon.	12
Bernardo, having been with ViSCA as president of the College, explained	13
that based on needs, the planning usually starts with the academic	14
programs and staff and then the physical aspects are determined.	15
Regarding Dr. Suarez inquiry if the development plan considered	16
the plan to convert ViSCA into a university; the OIC answered in the	17
affirmative. At this juncture, Hon. Bernardo reminded Dr. Go to pursue	18
with the preparation of the parliamentary bill for the conversion of	19
VisCA into a university. Informed (by Dr. Go) that the PIT OIC will	20
still meet with the faculty regarding the merger plan, the Deputy	21
Minister suggested that the parliamentary bill now be finalized without	22
PIT and get a sponsor. "It is easier to insert PIT in the bill later,	23
if they decide to join;" Hon. Bernardo soncluded.	2/
