Rationale

Universities, like VSU, are vital centers for learning, research, and development. The enhancement training program aims to equip security personnel with the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively manage security threats, handle emergencies, engage positively with the campus community, and maintain order with professionalism and respect.

Objectives

- Enhance courtesy and discipline: Instill a culture of professionalism (courtesy and discipline) among security personnel.
- Improve management of campus security: Equip personnel with effective strategies for managing security on campus.
- Educate on legal procedures: Ensure understanding of citizen's arrest, self-defense laws, and other relevant legal frameworks.
- Prepare for emergencies: Train personnel in bomb threat procedures, handling improvised explosive devices (IEDs), and emergency response protocols.
- Develop patrolling skills: Strengthen fundamental patrolling skills for effective I monitoring of the campus.
- Refine report writing: Enhance report writing skills for accurate documentation of incidents and actions.
- Teach self-defense techniques: Provide training in self-defense and Arnis de Mano to improve personal safety and response capabilities.
