***Comments from the Board of Regents:***


1. To provide more balance in the background, birds may be placed there.
2. The circle surrounding the tarsier be removed and that the tarsier be depicted a one that is climbing the tree. Furthermore, the size of the tarsier be reduced. Preferably, somewhere among the branches, a bird will be perched. If this is not possible, then the bird will be depicted as flying and will be placed in the free space to provide balance.
3. The drawing of the family be made larger so that it can still be seen and that it be larger than the animals depicted.

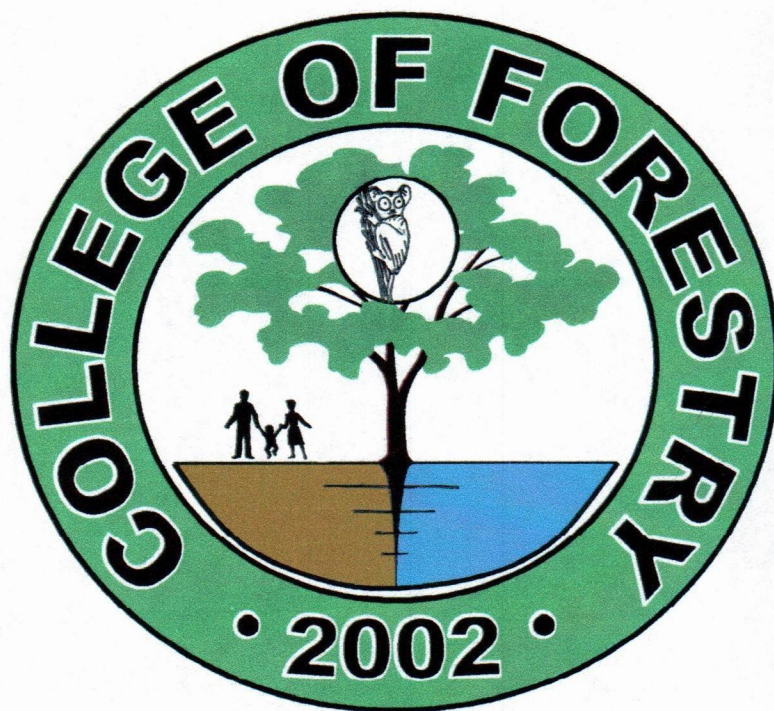

## COLLEGE OF FORESTRY PROPOSED LOGO

- The tree (*Pterocarpus indicus*) and the tarsier (*Tarsius syrichta*) represent the College's focus on the management and conservation of forest flora and fauna.
- The roots of the tree relate forest management and conservation to sustained land productivity, supply of quality water, and welfare of local people in communities.
- The brown triangular shape represents land, the blue -water, and the three human beings (household) – the local people in communities.
- The green circular periphery symbolizes the College's continuing innovations in instruction, research, extension and production for sustainable forest management and conservation.
