CAS LOGO: ITS MEANING

General:

The circular periphery of the logo stands for continuous and lasting commitment of CAS to instruction, research, extension and production. The circle is a symbol of continuous endeavor for perfection, wholistic and coordinated approaches for the total human development as embodied in the College's vision and mission.

Specific:

A. INNER FIGURE

The inner figure represents the fields which the College is entrusted to focus and orient its directions. Sciences and Arts.

One of the central figures typifies the "planetary model" of the atom by which matter is made up. This takes the central core basically because it forms the foundation of all sciences. And the seemingly spinning motion of the model portrays or depicts the dynamic and continuous endeavor of the units of the College in instruction, research and extension. The intertwining and interlocking rings/orbits of the atom represent unity and solidarity of the departments, present and future, being one in the name of LSU.

The other central figure is the column representing the field of arts. As this field is quite abstract, the significance of the Column brings us back to the ancient Greeks which helped shape the world of arts. Recognizing the earliest known poets, writers and philosophers, the Column typifies balance, beauty and proportion in arts. It also represents a solid foundation of knowledge by which university (LSU) students should be equipped with.

B. COLORS

The College of Arts and Sciences adopted three (3) basic colors for distinction and identification:

- > BLUE envisions an ideal peaceful co-existence of the CAS and LSU.
- > YELLOW projects CAS potentials for progress; and LSU gold mine in the future.
- > GREEN depicts a healthy outlook towards achieving its visions, missions and goals.
