Board Resolution No. 3, s. 2003

Approving the request of the BAS-Animal Health graduates pursuing the degree of Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) under the old "ladderized" DVM program that they be considered as old students thus are covered by the old tuition fee rates, and for Administration to identify the DVM students affected by the imposition of the new rates for the purpose of reimbursing them the difference between the new tuition fee rate and the old tuition fee rate for SY 2001-2002 and SY 2002-2003 following approved procedures and guidelines, and PROVIDED FURTHER THAT only the next three(3) batches of BAS-Animal Health graduates will be considered for inclusion in the old "ladderized" DVM program.

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




1. Only degree holders (i.e. BAS-Animal Health graduates, BS Biology, and etc.) are accepted in the two-year Veterinary Medicine degree program;
