
Proposal of the USSC in Granting Free

**GUIDELINES IN THE GRANT OF TUITION FEE EXEMPTION
TO COLLEGE STUDENT COUNCIL OFFICERS OF THE
LEYTE STATE UNIVERSITY**

*(As approved by the Board of Regents per
BOR Resolution No. 27, s. 2005, dated February 16, 2005)*

The Leyte State University Supreme Student Council (LSU USSC) requested the LSU-Board of Regents, during its 18th BOR Meeting dated October 27, 2004 held at the Leyte Normal University, Tacloban City, for the extension of the tuition fee exemption granted to the officers of the USSC to the officers of the College Supreme Student Councils. This request was manifested in order to give the student council officers a commensurate grant in consideration of their efforts and services during their tenure. This will, hopefully, make the student council itself attractive to potential student leaders who want to offer their services in the University.

After due discussion and deliberation of the request, the LSU-Board of Regents allowed the extension of the grant to 30 other members of the College Supreme Student Councils or an apportionment of 3 slots per CSSC.

Inasmuch as the USSC Council is in a federated system consisting many officers totalling 120 officers in all (Main and External), and since the slots given is very limited, it is necessary that guidelines on the grant of this additional privilege is necessary in order to ensure and facilitate a just and equal distribution of the grant.

Thus, the following guidelines were approved by the LSU Board of Regents as proposed and submitted by the USSC Board for final action.

IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES:

1. Three (3) slots will be given per College Supreme Student Council (CSSC) of each of the colleges of the University;
2. Each CSSC will be given the discretion as to the selection of who may avail of this privilege Provided, that the following criteria for qualification must be strictly adhered to and followed:
 - a. The grantee must be an elected officer of the CSSC of his/her respective college;
 - b. The grantee must not enjoy any other scholarship grant during the incumbency of his/her term;
 - c. The grantee must not have failing grades (5.0);
 - d. The grantee must be confirmed and officially endorsed by his/her colleagues in the CSSC through a Resolution, signed by the CSSC Officers and approved by the CSSC President, prior in its submission to the OSA/College Scholarship In-charge for evaluation and processing. The CSSC must also furnish the official certification to the USSC Board for information and follow-up.
3. The grantee may enjoy the tuition fee exemption privilege only during his/her incumbency as an officer of the CSSC unless suspended and revoked by the CSSC Board for reasons related to negligence of duty and gross disservice to the Council.
4. Violation of the Student Code of Conduct and the University Rules and Regulations will be a basis for withdrawal of privilege during his incumbency (if found guilty).
