



COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE (CA), Leyte State University (LSU) LOGO

General:

The **CA** logo takes the form of a circle, symbolic of life's dynamism and agriculture's universality as the backbone of human existence. Similarly, the spherical shape is adopted in congruence with the LSU logo.

Specifics:

The logo displays two bold letters **CA**, the accrue name for the **COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE** in **apple green** color which represents the color of *life* that reveals clear and vigorous approach towards enriched, updated *curricular activities* and *relevant programs in agriculture and allied fields*.

Within the letter C are three figurative representations, namely;

- **flask.** The flask containing a rustic-colored solution symbolizes the institution's relentless quest for excellence in agriculture and allied fields through the conduct of basic and applied researches.
- **head of a carabao.** The silhouette of the head of a carabao represents the livestock/poultry sector of agriculture.
- **rays.** The **eight (8) rays** radiating from the flask and forming like annular rings of the carabao's horn represent the **seven (7) departments** and **one (1) institute** comprising the CA, as follows;
 1. Department of Agronomy and Soil Science (**DASS**)
 2. Department of Horticulture (**DOH**)
 3. Department of Genetic Resources and Plant Breeding (**DGRPB**)
 4. Department of Pest Management (**DPM**)
 5. Department of Animal Science (**DAS**)
 6. Department of Family and Consumer Sciences (**DFCS**)
 7. Department of Development Communication (**DDC**)
 8. Institute for Strategic Research and Development Studies (**ISRDS**)

Within the letter C are two ventricle-like chambers. The **upper chamber** contains three leaf blades of varying shades of colors representing the plant sector of Agriculture.

The *figures* in the chamber at the lower half represent **people** or *Homo sapiens* who are the ultimate target beneficiaries of the College programs in **instruction, research, extension and production**.

In short, **THE LOGO OF THE COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE (CA), LEYTE STATE UNIVERSITY (LSU) SYMBOLIZES THE "WHEEL OF LIFE"**.
