BOR RESOLUTION NO. 103, s. 2011

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE PROPOSAL TO GRANT FULL HONORARIUM TO TEACHERS/PROFESSORS TEACHING WEEKEND GRADUATE CLASSES HAVING FIVE TO SEVEN STUDENTS ONLY PROVIDED THAT THE STUDENTS PAY THE APPROPRIATE FEES COMPUTED BY TAKING THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE MINIMUM CLASS SIZE EIGHT (8) STUDENTS AND THE ACTUAL NUMBER OF PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS DESIRING ENROLMENT IN THE COURSE AND SUBJECT TO EXISTING POLICIES AND GUIDELINES ON THIS MATTER

WHEREAS, the Leyte State University was created by virtue of Republic Act 9158 which converted the then Visayas State College of Agriculture (ViSCA) into a state university last 11 August 2001 which was later renamed Visayas State University (VSU) by virtue of R.A. 9437;

WHEREAS, Section 7 of R.A. 9158 specifically empowers the Board of Regents of the University to "exercise all the powers granted to the Board of Directors of a corporation under Section 36 of Batas Pambansa Blg. 68, otherwise known as the Corporate Code of the Philippines";

WHEREAS, Section 7, Paragraph (d) of R.A. 9158 empowers the Governing Board "to fix the tuition fees and other necessary school fees and charges such as, but not limited to, matriculation fees, graduation fees and laboratory fees, as it may deem proper and reasonable to impose after due consultations with the involved sectors";

WHEREAS, since the start of the weekend Graduate School offerings, the rates given to the professors is very much lower compared to that given by other SUCs in the Region;

WHEREAS, there is a need to increase the honoraria of the teachers/professors teaching weekend Graduate offerings in recognition of the tremendous task and responsibility attendant to this activity;

WHEREAS, the proposal was discussed by the University Administrative Council on the occasion of the 92nd UADCO Meeting held last 13 October 2011 at the PhilRootCrops Training Hall, VSU Main Campus, City of Baybay, Leyte.

WHEREAS, the UADCO passed UADCO Resolution No. 29, s. 2011 approving the proposal and strongly endorsing the proposal to the VSU Board of Regents for Approval.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED to approve the proposal to grant full honorarium to teachers/professors teaching weekend graduate classes having five (5) to seven (7) students only, *Provided that* the students pay the appropriate fees computed by taking the difference between the minimum class size of eight (8) and the actual number of prospective students desiring enrolment in the course and *Subject to* existing policies and guidelines on this matter.
